* Alfred Lord Tennyson was the most popular poet of the Victorian era. He was born in Somersby, Lincolnshire in England, the fourth of twelve children to George and Elizabeth Tennyson. Alfred attended Trinity College, Cambridge, where he won the Chancellor's Gold Medal in 1828 for his poem "Timbuctoo." In 1845 he received a government pension of £200 a year, which helped provide Tennyson with needed financial support. Despite the fact that he was legally blind and could not even see to eat without a monocle, he achieved great success as a poet. Tennyson was named Poet Laureate of England in 1850 and was later awarded his title "Lord" by Queen Victoria in 1884.
